The Struggle for Indigenous Land Demarcation

He holds a graduate degree in Public Law, with emphasis on Constitutional Law. He has served as a lawyer & legal advisor at the Indigenous Council of Roraima (CIR) since 2018 with expertise on Indigenous peoples' rights, environmental law, constitutional law, international law, and human rights.

She is Rômulo Gallego Fellow at the OAS InterAmerican Commission of Human Rights and holds a Master Degree on International Legal Studies from American University.
